BSA Medical Forms are important to our program, not only for Summer Camp and High Adventures, but for every Campout and Activity we do. They go with us on all Campouts. They are kept confidential, but if necessary are shown to a medical professional. It is important that all medical information be on the form. There have been a time or two when some critical information was left off because it was thought to be too personal. That can leave the leaders and possibly the Scout in a bad position. Allergies and other things like ADHD are important to be listed on the medical form. The parent should talk to me about anything like this.

Adults who may participate with us for 72 hours or less on Campouts or at Summer Camp are asked to complete parts A and B of the medical form. Registered leaders and adults participating on High Adventures and for longer than 72 hours cumulative at Summer Camp must also have part C signed by a doctor or medical profession.

I would like to have the original of the medical forms so that I can scan them into the computer to have access to rapidly reference and provide a copy for the various activities requiring it. I would like all medical forms by July 1, please.

The BSA has a new Youth Protection Training that every leader must take and parents should take also if they are going to be at Summer Camp or other Campouts. It is available online at my.scouting.org. You set up a logon and password there and click on Youth Protection Training. The training takes about 1 ½ hours.

Davis-Besse Nuclear Science Camporee October 12-14, 2018

We can take up to 20 Scouts and 5 Adults to this campout which will include a tour of part of the power plant. Scouts will earn the nuclear science merit badge. We will camp a few miles from the power plant. If you are interested, please let Mr. Horvath know by July 1, 2018. Cost is \$32 per Scout/Adult.

Philmont Scout Ranch High Adventure

6/15/19 - 6/28/19

In 2019 our troop will go to Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico. It is the premier high adventure camp for boy scouts. Scouts are required to be 14 years old or completed 8th grade and be first class rank by June 1, 2019 to attend. The cost is \$1950.00/person which includes airfare. Payment of \$400 payable to Great Trail Council is required with the application. A payment schedule is followed after registration. The maximum crew size is 10 scouts & 2 adults so if you are interested, please let Mr. Horvath know by July 1, 2018.

We have to have 2 deep adult supervision in the camp at all times. Sign up to help on the poster at the troop meetings or email Mr. Horvath. Shifts are 9-1, 1:30– 5:30, 7-10 pm, and 10 pm – 7am. Parent volunteers will have to complete youth protection training and provide Medical form, part A & B and possibly part C (if at camp 72 hours or more during the week.)
