How Scouts can sell popcorn:

- Show and Sells These are set up by the troop and sign up sheets will be available at scout meetings. St. Hilary Church Mass, Faith Lutheran Service, Drug Mart and Farmers Rail have been scheduled. Ideally, two scouts and a parent/shift. Product sold is split by the scouts who sold that day.
- 2. **Troop Blitz** date TBD. An organized day by the troop to canvas a neighborhood and sell the product door to door.
- Take Orders Scouts take orders and payment on their own and record on their own order forms. Product delivered by the Scout after November 19th. Recommended payment taken at the time of order.
- 4. **Show Deliver** Scouts go door to door in their own neighborhood with product and deliver and collect money on the spot.
- 5. Online orders Scouts email friends and family for sales. Great for out of town contacts. They pay with credit card and product is shipped directly to them. Shop online at http://www.prporpcornstore.com/ and http://www.whitleysfundraising.com/. Contact Jill Gallagher if you are interested in online sales to obtain your scouts online code so they get credit for any sales. Note: the product options online are slightly different than the order form options.

Scouts also need to write and sign a personalized contract with their parent/guardian that outlines rules for using the computer and mobile devices, including what can be downloaded, what can be posted, and consequences for inappropriate use.
